Objects on Display

There are approximately 200 artworks on display in buildings and outdoor areas throughout campus at any one time, which is why we've nicknamed ourselves "a museum without walls." Areas with the largest concentration of objects on display include:

- 3rd and 4th Floors of Beckman Hall
- Keck Center for Science and Engineering
- Moulton Hall
- 633 West Palm Building

- Henley Galleria (2nd Floor) in Argyros Forum
- Outdoor Sculptures on main campus

Objects not on Display
