BILL COOPER, a professor of Civil and Environmental Engineering at UC Irvine, has been taking photos of butterflies for years and can vividly remember the first one back in 1972. He first encountered the butterflies of Iguazú Falls in 1983. In 2008, he finally made it back to Argentina with a camera in hand, and in five days he took 5,600 photographs of 99 species. He has returned two times (2010 and 2012) and now has more than 15,000 pictures and videos of these butterflies. Come see this stunning show of diversity in the Doy and Dee Henley Reading Room gallery wall.
