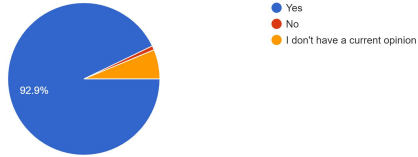
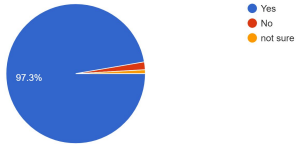

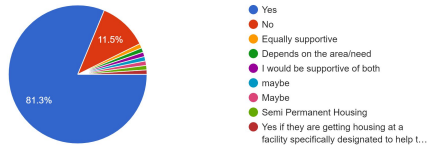
Do you think homelessness is a pressing issue that needs to be addressed?

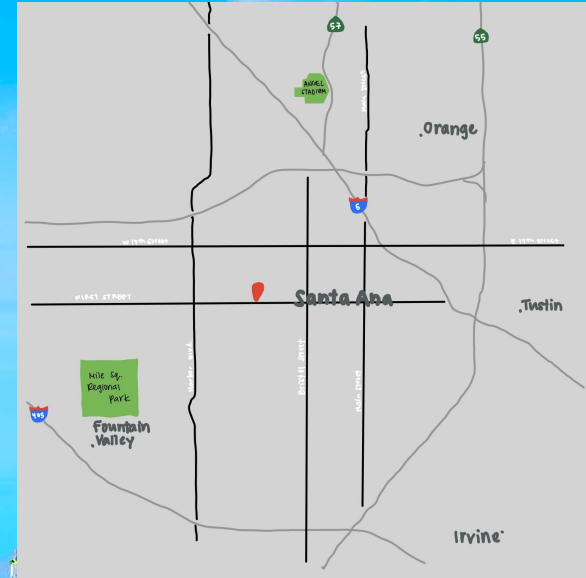
Would you be more supportive of permanent housing, such as apartments, which would provide on-site services (job training, counseling, mental health, child care, etc.)?

2323 W 1st Street

Building Specifics:

- Open Space Floor plan:
 - 400 - 125 sq feet cubicle-type spaces
- 1 Recreational Room - 2000 sq feet
- 1 Doctor's office/ Clinic - 2500 sq feet
- 1 Cafeteria - 3500 sq feet
- 1 Administrative Office 2000 sq feet
- Total: 60,000 sq feet
- Approx: \$288 dollars per sq foot in hard costs: approx: \$17.3 million
 - Plus 25% for additional costs: \$21.6 million

- The State of California

Why temporary housing instead of permanent?

- Temporary housing has been proven to have longer lasting effects; permanent housing might allow residents to begin relying on the services without trying to find a way to a better situation

Will there be a time limit for how long someone can stay there?

- This will depend on each individual

How will the safety of the residents and staff be accounted for?

- There will be on sight security at the facility
